### Block 46

#### Cutting:

Color 3	2 @ 2 <sup>3</sup> / <sub>8</sub> x 2 <sup>3</sup> / <sub>8</sub> 1 @ 4 <sup>1</sup> / <sub>4</sub> x 4 <sup>1</sup> / <sub>4</sub>
Color 6	2 @ 2 <sup>3</sup> / <sub>8</sub> x 2 <sup>3</sup> / <sub>8</sub>
Color 8	8 @ 2 <sup>3</sup> / <sub>8</sub> x 2 <sup>3</sup> / <sub>8</sub>

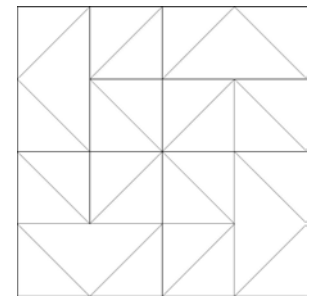
#### Techniques:

HST

GEESE

#### Block Breakdown:

Block 46 is a fun one. The first thing I notice with this block is the pinwheel center and the four Flying Geese on the corners. If we were to approach it with those two things in mind we would have to use a partial seam to finish the block. That is not a hard thing to do, but since we also have the option of sewing the units into quadrants, let's go that way.



#### Sewing:

So, begin by making four flying geese units. The cutting directions are for making the 4 at a time. Use whichever method you prefer. Use the 4 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> Color 3 square and the four of the Color 8 squares. Press towards Color 8.



In the Intro Video, I said that it would be easy to use the 4 at a time HST method for making the other rest of the HST. That certainly is true and what I had intended to do. But...I cut and use the 2 at a time method during the cutting and sewing videos. So, my apologies use whichever method you prefer! They both work awesome.

Make four HST using Color 8/Color 3 and four using Color 8/Color 6. Press them all towards Color 3 and Color 6. Trim to 2"

Sew these into pairs following the diagram. You will need 4. Press towards Color 3



It is time to make your quadrants.  
They are all identical.  
Press towards the flying goose.
